

## Learning Points – Which Part Score?

Holding the greater share of HCP, is a 5-2 ♥ fit better than NT?

### The Bidding

Our Precision auction landed us in 2♥ (NT was also in play). Natural bidding will likely find either NT or ♥ as well. The Precision auction was more revealing as South advertised values and majors.

### The Play

23 HCP and no play for 3NT means this hand will be a battle of partials. NT is possible but here ♥s might be more likely to produce overtricks. Declarer counts 3 top winners and 4 losers. 3<sup>rd</sup> round ruffs are available in East's hand. Usually ruffing in the long trump hand gains no tricks unless a dummy reversal is possible. Dummy's trumps are too weak to reverse.

Since South showed the majors, the lead might be from a shortness. Time will tell if it's a singleton or doubleton. The ♣J fetched the ♣K from North won by East's ♣A. A small ♦ caused South to part with the ♦A and a ♣ continued to the ♣J in dummy. Declarer cashes 2 more ♦s and leads a small ♠ toward the ♠K. South ducks. East will score 3 trump tricks in due time. 9 tricks +140 for EW was worth 5.5 of 7 MPs.

### Post Mortem

Opening 1NT with a 5 card major can help when the shape is 5332. With 5422, it's better to open the major and rebid the 4 card suit. Interestingly East's two doubletons appear to contribute no extra tricks to the ♥ contract. East's ♦ length is what led to extra tricks – the same tricks are available in NT! In fact the small ♠ doubleton in East serves as a stopper in the ♥ contract. In NT, NS will score several ♠s and hold EW to 8 tricks. Notice if South's spades are in North's hand, 1 NT might go down, while 2♥ will likely make.

### Learning Points

1. Consider a Major suit partial when a 5-2 fit is known and the opener has a 2<sup>nd</sup> suit.
2. Avoid opening 1NT with a 5 card major and 5422 shape unless most of your HCP are in the 2 card suits. Avoid entirely if 54 in the majors.
